BUKIT PANJANG GOVERNMENT HIGH SCHOOL EDUSAVE CHARACTER AWARD 2019

The Edusave Character Award (ECHA) is presented to Singaporean students in recognition of their exemplary character and outstanding personal qualities through their behaviour and actions.

QUOTA OF AWARDS

The ECHA is capped at 2% of the enrolment of Singaporean students. In BPGHS, the number of awards allocated for each course [Express, Normal (Academic) and Normal (Technical)] will be based on the student enrolment. Hence, the maximum number of awards presented to the Express, Normal (Academic) and Normal (Technical) course in 2019 will be eleven, seven and two respectively.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Nominees for the ECHA should fulfil the following criteria:

- 1) Must be Singapore citizens;
- 2) Must serve as a role model by consistently demonstrating exemplary character and upholding school values; and
- 3) Must have a Conduct Grade of 'Excellent' or 'Very Good'.

The qualities associated with the School Values are listed below:
