



About the Joint Intake Exercise (JIE)

- The Joint Intake Exercise (JIE) is applicable for 4NA and 4NT students
- The JIE includes applications for:

1. JIE-N: 2-year Nitec course for N-Level holders

- For students who have completed the N-Level examinations
- Students can choose to take it under Full-Time Education or Traineeship

2. JIE-E: 3-year Nitec course with Enhanced Foundation Programme

- For students who have completed their N-Level examinations with 0 or 1 passes
- Students undergo 2 years Enhanced Nitec Foundation before Year 3

3. JIE-H: Direct Entry Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

- For eligible **4NA students** who have completed the most recent N-Level examinations
- DPP students take a 2-year Higher Nitec course.

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JUST-IN-TIME INFORMATION ON JIE APPLICATION (JAN 2022 INTAKE)

Information For Students on Key Dates for Jan 2022 intake (page 6)

- 1. All N(A)*/N(T) school leavers are encouraged to put in an application during the 1st Phase (Main Phase) between 17 Dec 2021 (2.30pm) to 21 Dec 2021 (5pm). Application results for the 1st Phase will be released on 30 Dec 2021 at 9am.
- 2. If you wish to appeal, please accept the course offered <u>before</u> applying in the 2nd Phase (Late Application/Appeal Phase) between <u>30 Dec 2021 to 4 Jan 2022</u>. The application results for the 2nd Phase will be known on <u>11 Jan 2022 at 9am</u>.
- 3. Unsuccessful applicants can appeal under the 3rd Phase (Final Top-up Phase) between 11 Jan to 20 Jan 2022 and 26 Jan to 8 Feb 2022 for courses with vacancies. The application results for the 3rd Phase will be known between 14 Jan to 26 Jan 2022 and 26 Jan to 15 Feb 2022.

^{*}N(A) school leavers who are not eligible to progress/repeat in MOE schools.

Key Pointers for Students on ITE's Joint Intake Exercise (JIE) for Admission to Nitec Courses

ALL N(T) students and N(A) students (who are not progressing to 5N(A) or repeating 4N(A)) are eligible for JIE.

Keen competition for Nitec and Higher Nitec courses, so use all 12 choices wisely!

Participation in Main Phase is key to secure a place in ITE!

If you are keen in the work & learn option, you may consider applying for the ITE Traineeship programme. Do apply in the Main Phase to avoid missing a place in ITE!

If you are unsuccessful in EAE, make sure you apply in Main Phase to avoid missing a place!

If you have received an additional letter, then you are eligible for the 3-year Nitec Programme (eNFP).

If you are eligible for tenses, make sure you apply for the 2-year Nitec entry; entry first before applying for entry;

The eNFP helps to build the necessary literacy and numeracy foundations that will enable you to successfully complete your *Nitec* course!

If you are counter-offered a course, accept it first before appealing to another course you may be more interested in!

For Singapore Citizens/Singapore Permanent Residents

- An Enrolment Letter, which contains registration details, will be sent to the email address that you have provided during application.
- Report to your posted College in white top and black bottom on <u>Mon 10</u>
 <u>Jan 2022 at the time as indicated in your enrolment letter</u> to register for your course and commence training. Please <u>bring with you your NRIC</u> on that day.
- If you do not pay your fees by **Mon 10 Jan 2022**, you will be deemed to have withdrawn your training place and the place will be offered to other eligible applicants appealing for a place in the course.

Successful acceptance of Offer (page 64)

For International Students

- Apply for a Student Pass via SOLAR+ by **Mon 10 Jan 2022**. A separate letter will be sent via email to inform you of the details.
- After obtaining your Student Pass, call or email to your posted College to make an appointment to report to the College, pay your 1st term fees and register for the course.
- Submit the completed Application Form for InterBank GIRO for payment of 2nd term fees onwards and medical report (if applicable).
- You are allowed to commence your training only after you have done the above.
- If you do not report to the College to commence training by Mon 14 Feb 2022, your training place will be withdrawn and offered to other eligible applicant appealing for a place in the course.
- The courses for January 2022 term will start on Mon 10 Jan 2022.

Appeal for Admission or Transfer (page 65-67)

Students who had been offered a course

- Accept the course before appealing for a change
- Submit another application via the internet

Students who had not been offered a course

- Submit an appeal for courses you are eligible to apply for
- Consider applying for Traineeship course structured mode of training that enables you to learn valuable skills in an actual work environment and earn a salary at the same time. Depending on your chosen course, the duration varies from 1 to 2 years. (page 121-132)

Please Note the Following:

- Students who
 - <u>did not apply</u> during the 1st Phase (Main Phase) may be contacted by your teachers to understand your reasons and, where necessary, assist you to complete the ITE application online in the Appeal and Top-Up Phases.
 - applied in the 1st Phase (Main Phase) and were <u>counter-offered courses</u> may also be contacted by your teachers to advise/remind you to accept the counter-offer <u>before</u> submitting an appeal.
- 2. Students who are not enrolled in any course in secondary school or Post-Secondary Education Institutions (i.e. Poly/ITE/NAFA/LaSalle) by May 2022 may be contacted by MOE for further support and guidance.

Direct Entry Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP) Eligibility

 Secondary 4N(A) students who sat for their GCE N-Level examinations in 2021 as a school candidate and have met the following requirements:

a. Obtained an ELMAB3 (EL, Math, Best 3 other subjects) aggregate of 19 points or better (excluding CCA bonus points); and

b. Met the course-specific entry requirements

- If you do not report to the College to commence training by <u>Thu 9 Feb 2022 (5pm)</u>, your training place will be withdrawn and offered to other eligible applicant appealing for a place in the course.
- The preparatory courses for January 2022 term will start on Mon 10 Jan 2022.

Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP) Eligibility

• Sec 4N(A) students who have sat for their GCE N-Level examinations in 2021 as a school candidate are eligible to apply for the PFP if they:

a. Obtained an ELMAB3 (EL, Math, Best 3 other subjects) aggregate of 12 points or better (excluding CCA bonus points); and

b. Met the course-specific entry requirements

Application for PFP only opens in January 2022, on the day of the GCE O-Level results release day.

1. How do I apply for DPP when my GCE O-Level grades are not out? Do I have to wait until January 2022 to apply?

You will combine your **GCE N-Level examination** results and **school-based O-Level preliminary examination** results to apply for the DPP. Do not wait until January 2022 to apply if you are keen on DPP.

Upon the release of the GCE O-Level examination results, ITE will verify if DPP applicants who had previously used school-based preliminary examination results for admission have fulfilled the necessary criteria to continue in the DPP.

2. How are my school-based O-Level preliminary examination grades converted?

School O-Level Prelim Grade	Converted N(A) Grade
A1-B3	1
B4-C6	2
D7-E8	3
F9	4

3. After the release of the GCE O-Level results, can I apply for the DPP using a combination of my GCE O- and N-Level results if I am newly eligible?

Yes.

4. I am interested in both the PFP and the DPP. What should I do, given that the DPP application is in December and the PFP application is in January? Can I apply for DPP and PFP at the same time?

You can apply for both DPP and PFP. However, if you are offered a place in both the DPP and PFP, you may only accept one course offer. Students who accept both offers will have their offers voided.

Option 1	Option 2
First progress to Secondary 5 and then apply for both the PFP and DPP upon release of the GCE O-Level examination results in January.	Apply for and accept DPP first. Apply for PFP after the release of the GCE O-Level results. If you decide to accept your PFP offer in January, you can withdraw from the DPP course and apply for a refund of your DPP enrolment fees, subject to ITE's approval.

Important Note for 4NA students

Report to BPGHS on 4 January 2022 (Tuesday):

Students without a confirmed place in ITE/DPP

• Students waiting for GCE O-Level results to apply for PFP, even if you are very sure you are eligible, as eligibility does not guarantee placement

Students moving on to Sec 5A

2. The school will inform you when your School Graduation Certificate is ready for collection.
