

# About the Joint Admission Exercise (JAE)

## Who is Eligible

- The Joint Admission Exercise (JAE) is applicable for **4E and 5NA students** who have sat for the O-Level examination.
- Students who were offered a place in JC through DSA-JC but do not meet the JC admission criteria (L1R5 aggregate score of 20 and below, excluding CCA bonus points)

## Who is Not Eligible

- Students who have a confirmed place in an institution through DSA-JC, Poly EAE and ITE EAE and met the admission criteria.

# Successful acceptance of Offer (page 13)

## For JC/MI

- Report to JC/MI on 3 February 2023 (Fri).
- Student who do not report to the JC/MI on this date will be deemed to have forfeited his/her place. This place will be made available to other eligible applicants appealing for a place in the course.

## For Polytechnic

- Receive an enrolment package by end February and complete the online enrolment by the date stated in the package.
- Any student who does not complete the online enrolment by the stated date will be deemed to have forfeited his/her place. This place will be made available to other eligible applicants appealing for a place in the course.

- Receive an enrolment email on the day of release of JAE posting results.

# Appeal/Transfer

## For JC/MI (page 13)


- Approach the JC/MI directly.
- Students must meet minimum entry requirements to JC/MI and the net L1R5/L1R4 aggregate score of the lowest ranked student who is admitted to the course in that JC/MI in the 2023 JAE.
- Accept and report to the institution you are posted to while awaiting appeal results.

# Appeal/Transfer

## For Polytechnic or ITE courses (page 14)

- Submit appeal application on the combined polytechnic and ITE Higher Nitec appeals portal at [jaeappeal.edu.sg](http://jaeappeal.edu.sg)
- **Use all your 6 JAE appeals choices** carefully
- Students must meet the minimum entry requirements for their chosen polytechnic or ITE courses and the aggregate score of the lowest ranked student posted to these courses in the 2023 JAE.
- You will be informed of your appeal outcome through the online appeals portal and SMS notification.
- If you did not receive a posting by the end of JAE appeals, you will be offered an alternative course. **If you are offered an alternative posting, do accept it and give it a try, as it will give you a chance to continue your studies.**<sup>20</sup>

OR **Form P** (for 4NA students who qualify for PFP)

Sign on the class list with your form teachers to acknowledge that you have received all the documents.

## Important Note

1. Check that your personal particulars are printed correctly on the results slip and certificate.
2. The school will inform you when your School Graduation Certificate is ready for collection.
3. School computer labs are available for use during office hours (8am to 5pm) on weekdays (Mon – Fri) during the application period.

# Appeal for Review of Results

- Candidates who had sat for 2022 GCE O-Level examination may apply to appeal for a review of their results.
- All appeals by candidates together with the payment of appeal fees must be submitted through schools **by Wednesday, 18 January 2023**. Applications submitted after the closing date will not be considered.
- Inform your Form Teacher of your wish to appeal. Obtain an appeal form from the GO.
