When you receive your results, you may experience a range of emotions.

Managing these emotions well will allow you to stay calm and make rational decisions. Keep a lookout for some of these signs in your peers or yourself.

Deliberately avoiding others

Increased irritability, restlessness, agitation, stress and anxiety

Sending or posting moody messages on social media

Talking about death or dying

Reacting differently or gradually losing interest in things they used to like

Eating more than usual or having a much reduced appetite

Sleep pattern changes with difficulty falling asleep or oversleeping

Slowing down of energy levels

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
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Supporting Your Friend



Admissions Exercises for N-Level Students



Details of Admission Exercises (1)

ITE EAE – ITE Early Admissions Exercise

ITE EAE is an aptitude-based admissions exercise that allows students to apply and receive conditional offers for admission to ITE based on their aptitude and interest, prior to receiving their final GCE N-Level examination results. It allows students to demonstrate their aptitudes and interests apart from academic grades, thus allowing a wider range of talents to be recognised.

JIE 'N'/JIE 'E' – Joint Intake Exercise

The JIE 'N' is for 2-year *Nitec* or 3-year *Higher Nitec* courses offered by ITE.

The JIE 'E' is for GCE N(T) students to apply for the 3-year *Nitec* course with Enhanced *Nitec* Foundation Programme.

Details of Admission Exercises (2)

DPP – Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme

DPP allows Secondary 4N(A) students to be admitted directly into a two-year *Higher Nitec* programme at ITE without having to sit for the O-Level examinations or undergo a *Nitec* programme.

DPP students who successfully complete their *Higher Nitec* courses at ITE and attain the required qualifying Grade Point Average (GPA) scores are guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to their *Higher Nitec* course.

NFP – NAFA Foundation Programme

The NFP is a full-time one-year practice-based programme targeted at N(A) students, to prepare them for the successful enrolment and completion of a diploma programme at NAFA. Students enrolled into the NFP are offered provisional places in their preselected diploma courses, and can progress to the first year of the course upon the successful completion of the NFP.

PFP – Polytechnic Foundation Programme

PFP is a one-year programme that offers a practice-oriented curriculum taught by polytechnic lecturers to better prepare polytechnic-bound N(A) students for entry into selected polytechnic diploma courses. PFP students are given provisional places in diploma programmes, subject to them passing all modules in the 1-year PFP.

About the Joint Intake Exercise (JIE) (page 3)

- The Joint Intake Exercise (JIE) is applicable for 4NA and 4NT students
- The JIE includes applications for:
- 1. JIE-N: 3-year Higher Nitec and 2-year Nitec courses
 - For students who have completed the N-Level examinations
 - Students can choose to take it under Full-Time Education or Traineeship

2. JIE-E: 3-year Nitec course with Enhanced Foundation Programme

- For **4NT students** who have completed their N-Level examinations with 0 or 1 passes
- Students undergo 2 years Enhanced Nitec Foundation before Year 3
- 3. JIE-H: Direct Entry Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)
 - Eligible 4NA students may apply for courses under JIE-H and JIE-N. <u>However if you</u> are offered a course under JIE-H, you will not be offered a course under JIE-N
 - DPP students take a 10 weeks preparatory course followed by 2-year Higher Nitec course.

JUST-IN-TIME INFORMATION ON JIE APPLICATION (JAN 2022 INTAKE)

Information For Students on Key Dates for Jan 2023 intake (page 6)

- All N(A)*/N(T) school leavers are encouraged to put in an application during the 1st Phase (Main Phase) between <u>19 Dec 2022 (2.30pm) to 22 Dec 2022 (5pm).</u> Application results for the 1st Phase will be released on <u>30 Dec 2022 at 9am</u>.
- If you wish to appeal, please accept the course offered <u>before</u> applying in the 2nd Phase (Late Application/Appeal Phase) between <u>30 Dec 2022 to 4 Jan 2023</u>. The application results for the 2nd Phase will be known on <u>11 Jan 2023 at 9am</u>.
- Unsuccessful applicants can appeal under the 3rd Phase (Final Top-up Phase) between <u>11 Jan to 19</u> Jan 2023 and 27 Jan to 8 Feb 2023 for courses with vacancies. The application results for the 3rd Phase will be known between <u>16 Jan to 27 Jan 2023</u> and <u>27 Jan to 14 Feb 2022</u>.

Key Pointers for Students on ITE's Joint Intake Exercise (JIE) for Admission to Nitec Courses

ALL N(T) students and N(A) students (who are not progressing to 5N(A) or repeating 4N(A)) are eligible for JIE.

Keen competition for Nitec and Higher Nitec courses, so <u>use all 12 choices wisely!</u>

Participation in Main Phase is key to secure a place in ITE! If you are keen in the work & learn option, you may consider applying for the ITE Traineeship programme. Do apply in the Main Phase to avoid missing a place in ITE!

If you are unsuccessful in EAE, make sure you apply in Main Phase to avoid missing a place!

If you have received an additional letter, then you are eligible for the 3-year Nitec Programme (eNFP).

If you are eligible for eNFP, make sure you apply for the 2-year Nited and 3-year Higher Nited first before applying for eNFP!

The eNFP helps to build the necessary literacy and numeracy foundations that will enable you to successfully complete your Nitec course!

If you are counter-offered a course, accept it first before appealing for another course you may be more interested in! OFFICAL (CLOSED) \ NON-SENSITIVE



- a) Enter NRIC / FIN and Date of Birth to start application. You may also apply using SingPass.
- b) Upon completion of application, applicants will receive their web ID and password.

Do print a copy of the verification slip for your own reference as you will need the web ID and password to view your application results later.

Successful acceptance of Offer (page 65)

For Singapore Citizens/Singapore Permanent Residents

- An Enrolment Letter, which contains registration details, will be sent to the email address that you have provided during application.
- Report to your posted College in white top and black bottom on <u>Mon</u>
 <u>9 Jan 2023 at the time as indicated in your enrolment letter</u> to register for your course and commence training. Please <u>bring with you your NRIC</u> on that day.
- If you do not pay your fees by <u>Mon 9 Jan 2023</u>, you will be deemed to have withdrawn your training place and the place will be offered to other eligible applicants appealing for a place in the course.

Successful acceptance of Offer (page 65)

For International Students

- Apply for a Student Pass via SOLAR+ by Mon 9 Jan 2023. A separate letter will be sent via email to inform you of the details.
- After obtaining your Student Pass, call or email to your posted College to make an appointment to report to the College, pay your 1st term fees and register for the course.
- Submit the completed Application Form for InterBank GIRO for payment of 2nd term fees onwards and medical report (if applicable).
- You are allowed to commence your training only after you have done the above.
- If you do not report to the College to commence training by <u>Mon 13 Feb 2023</u>, your training place will be withdrawn and offered to other eligible applicant appealing for a place in the course.
- The courses for January 2022 term will start on Mon 9 Jan 2023.

Appeal for Admission or Transfer (page 66-68)

Students who had been offered a course

- Accept the course before appealing for a change
- Submit another application via the internet

Students who had not been offered a course

- Submit an appeal for courses you are eligible to apply for
- Alternatively, consider applying for Traineeship course structured mode of training that enables you to learn valuable skills in an actual work environment and earn a salary at the same time. Depending on your chosen course, the duration varies from 1 to 2 years. (page 124-135)

Apply for PFP only

Report to BPGHS on 3 Jan for Sec 5

(Note: Being eligible for PFP does not guarantee placement into a PFP course)

Given Form P if eligible. Apply for PFP upon release of O level results.

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 If the application is successful and the course offer is accepted, you can withdraw from Sec 5 – last day of school 27 Jan 2023

Apply for DPP only

- Given Form N if eligible
- Apply for DPP on release of NA results, from 19 Dec to 22 Dec, 5pm.
- If application is successful and course offer is accepted, there is no need to report to BPGHS on 3 Jan 2023.

The second se

 If you do not have a confirmed place in DPP, but you are eligible for progression to Sec 5, you should report to BPGHS on 3 Jan to continue with Sec 5.

Apply for DPP and PFP (not interested in Sec 5)

- Given Form N if eligible
- Apply for DPP on release of NA results from 19 to 22 Dec, 5pm.
- If the application is successful and the course offer is accepted, you can start 10 week DPP prep programme in ITE on Jan 2023.
- No need to report to BPGHS on 3 Jan.
- Upon release of O level results, apply for PFP if you are given Form P.
- If successful in PFP, you can withdraw from DPP and apply for refund of school fees (subjected to ITE's approval)

Apply for DPP (2nd phase) and PFP (Progress to Sec 5 first)

- No need to do anything in December
- Report to BPGHS on 3 Jan for Sec 5
- Upon release of O level results, apply for DPP and PFP concurrently.
- If successful in DPP or PFP, you can withdraw from sec 5 (last day is 27 Jan 2023)

Note: if you do not apply for DPP in first phase (Dec 2022), the number of vacancies open to you in second phase (Jan 2023) will be limited.

FAQs from 4NA students

 How do I apply for DPP when my GCE O-Level grades are not out? Do I have to wait until January 2022 to apply?

You will combine your **GCE N-Level examination** results and **school-based O-Level preliminary examination** results to apply for the DPP. Do not wait until January 2022 to apply if you are keen on DPP.

Upon the release of the GCE O-Level examination results, ITE will verify if DPP applicants who had previously used school-based preliminary examination results for admission have fulfilled the necessary criteria to continue in the DPP.

2. How are my school-based O-Level preliminary examination grades converted?

School O-Level Prelim Grade	Converted N(A) Grade
A1-B3	1
B4-C6	2
D7-E8	3

The GCE O-Level grade of 9 and GCE N(A) grade of U will not be considered for computation of the ELMAB3 aggregate score.

FAQs from students

3. How do I appeal for review of results?

- Your appeal application must reach SEAB within five (5) working days from the date of the release of results. SEAB will not accept your appeal application if it is received after the deadline.
- You can expect to receive the outcome through your school, within six (6) weeks after the appeal deadline.
- You shall make full payment of the appeal application fees upon submission of your appeal application to your school. The following appeal fees will be charged for each subject.
- Reasons related to Special Consideration (e.g. unwell, bereavement) cannot be considered for the appeal for review of results.
