



1) CCA grades

Excellent: 2 points

2) Pass in English and Higher Mother Tongue

3) Pass in Malay/Chinese (Special programme) or Bahasa Indonesia (BI) as 3rd Language

2 points for JC/MI courses, provided these choices come before any polytechnic/ITE courses

5) Students who apply for and are accepted into CLEP or MLEP

2 points

4) Affiliation to JC

2 points, for students from feeder schools if they choose their affiliated JC course(s) as 1st choice or 1st and 2nd choices

MOE Financial Assistance Scheme (FAS)

Benefits / Subsidies

- 1) 100% waiver of school fees
- 2) 100% waiver of standard miscellaneous fees
- 3) Free textbooks and stationery in the approved textbook list
- 4) Free school attire comprising 2 sets of uniform, 2 sets of PE attire, 2 pairs of socks and 1 pair of shoes
- 5) Transport subsidy for students taking public transport to school
- 6) Meal subsidy for students
