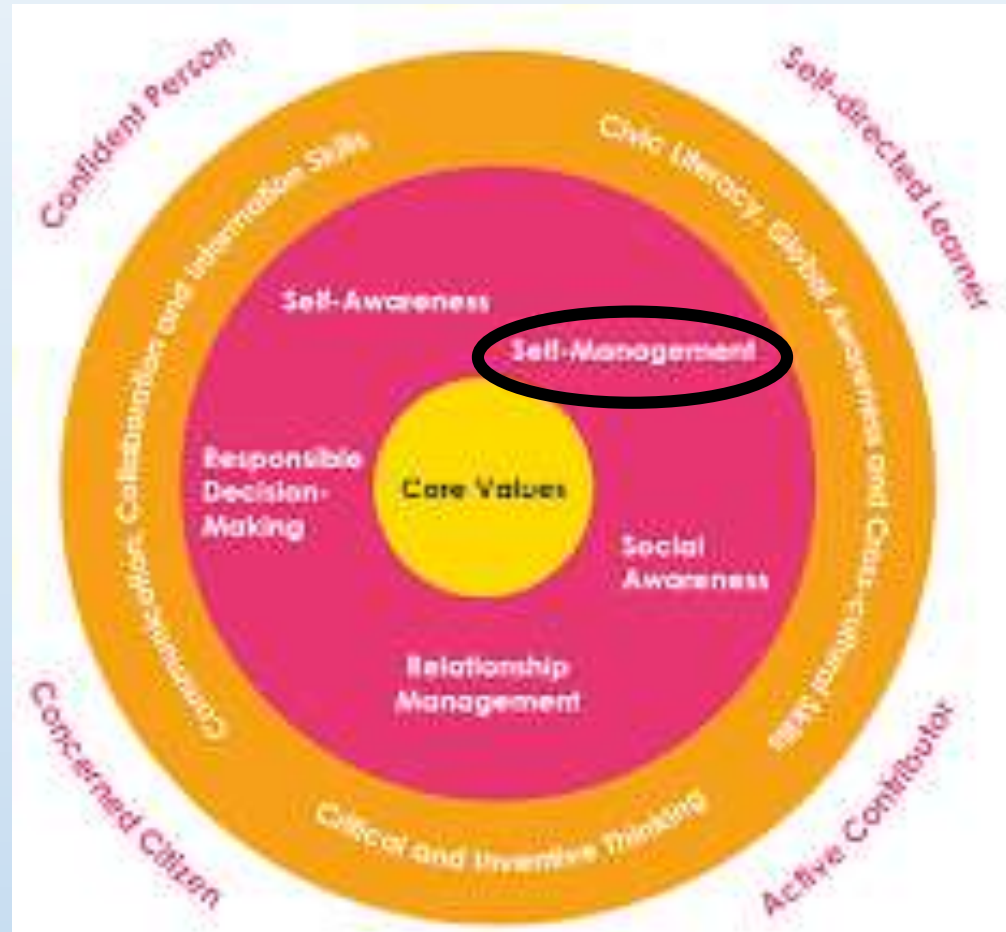

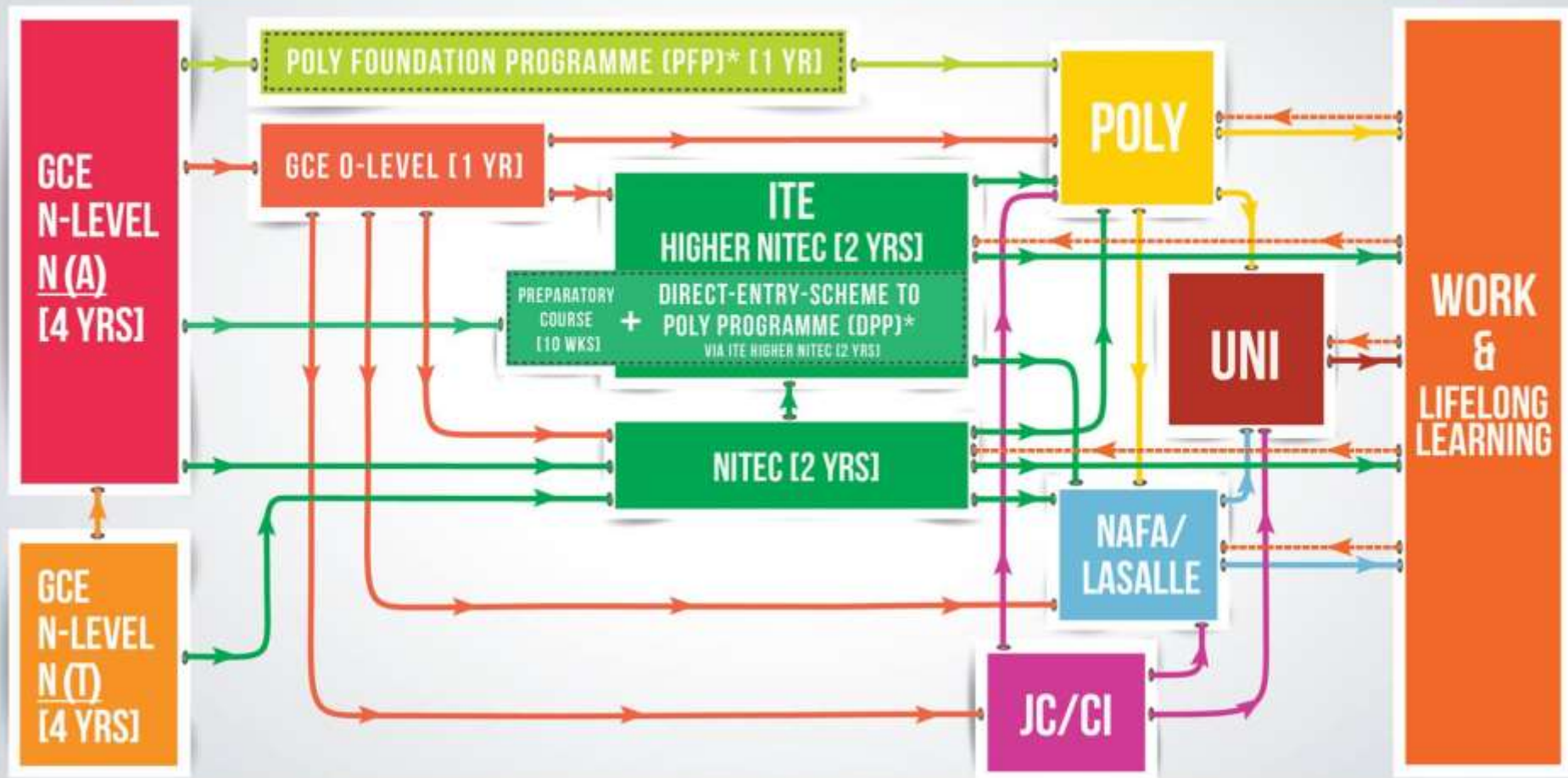

POLYTECHNIC FOUNDATION PROGRAMME (PFP)

- One-year diploma-specific foundation programme at the polytechnics
- Offers a practice-oriented curriculum taught by polytechnic lecturers to better prepare students for entry into the relevant Polytechnic Diploma courses
- Upon passing all modules in PFP, students will be given provisional places in diploma programmes (*Polytechnic Year 1*)
- About 1500 places will be offered
- More than 80% of diploma course offerings at the polytechnics

Who should apply: Students who meet the PFP eligibility criteria* and are certain that they wish to pursue a polytechnic education

* Eligibility Check:

- Sec 4N(A) student who has sat for GCE N-Level 2019
- Obtained ELMAB3 (English, Math, 3 Best subjects) aggregate of **12 points or less** (before deduction of CCA bonus points)
- Obtained Grade 3 or better for all subjects used in the computation of your ELMAB3 aggregate (*Note: Certain PFP courses require an EL grade of 2.*)

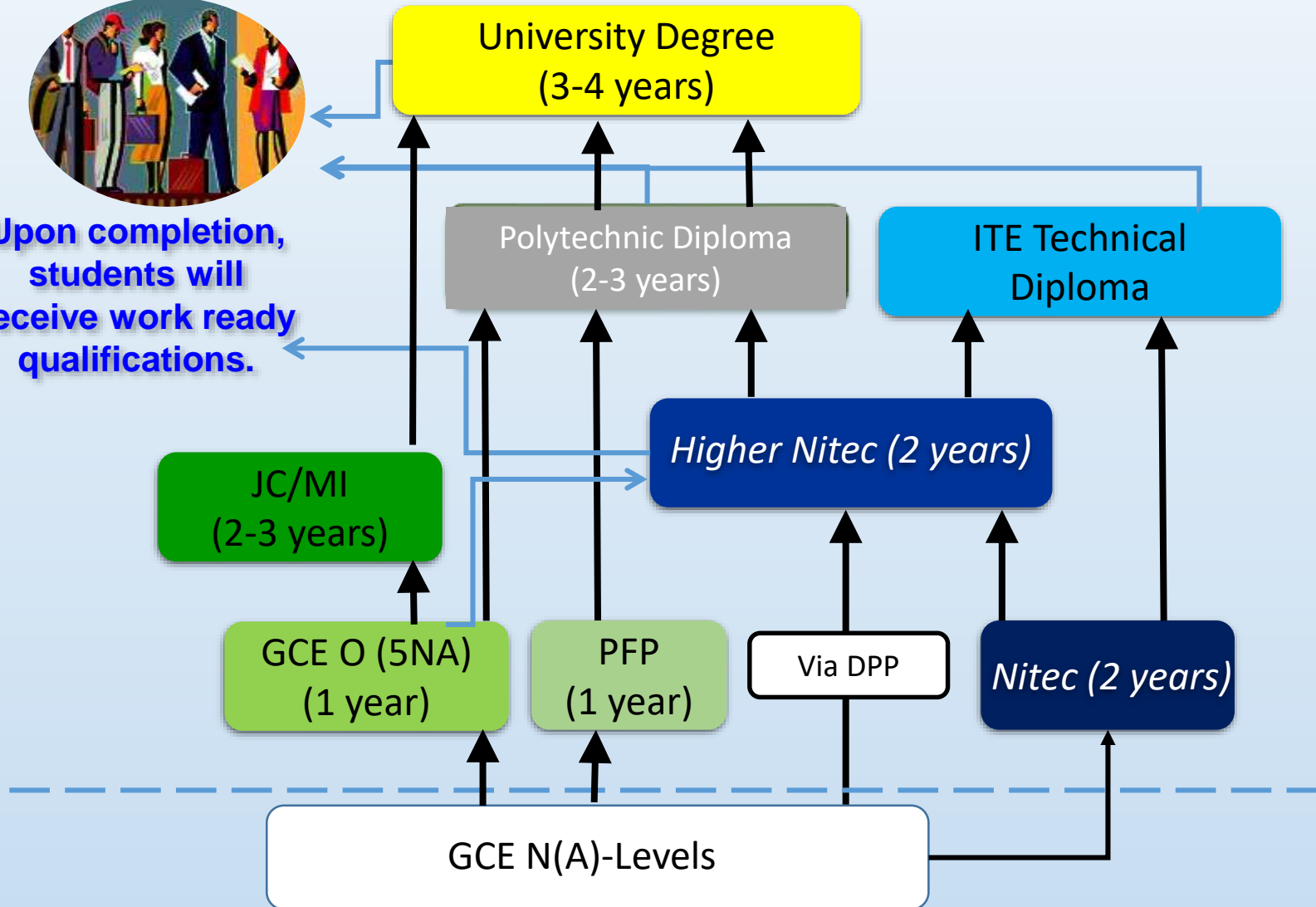
