

Absence from School

- Report to school by 7.20am. Flag raising will commence at 7.30 am sharp
- Parent / Guardian must call the school to notify the General Office of their child's / ward's absence by 7.30am or before the morning assembly.
- Absence from school must be supported by a medical certificate or a letter of excuse (up to a maximum of three letters per semester) from the parent/ guardian. This medical certificate or letter must be handed in to the Form Teacher the very day the student returns to school.

Absence from School

- The following constitutes valid reasons to support a letter from the parent/ guardian: personal illness, emergencies at home, death within the immediate family or where permission has been granted by the school authority. The following are considered as unauthorized absences: going on overseas trips or holidays during curriculum time, and engaging in unofficial activities during school hours
- Disciplinary action will be taken against students found playing truant or absenting themselves from school without a valid reason.

Absence from School

 Students who are absent for lessons/tests/examinations must produce a medical certificate to cover the period of absence. Students absent for tests or examinations without a medical certificate will be given a zero mark for the paper that they missed.


Sec 2 Streaming

- Impact of choice of subjects during streaming
 - Subject combination at Sec 3 and 4 leading to national examinations
 - Options of post-secondary educational pathways
 - Future career pathways
- Students are streamed based on
 - Personal preference/choice
 - Academic merits

Sec 2 Streaming

- Normal Academic: EMB3 Computation
 - E : EL
 - M : Mathematics
 - B3 : Best 3 subjects
- Target for EMB3: ≤ 12 points
- Min. Required Grades for each subject is 3
 (Eligibility criteria for PFP)








MULTIPLE PATHWAYS FOR N(A) AND N(T) STUDENTS

Sec 3 N(A) 2020 Subject Combinations

Subject-Based Banding (SBB) at Lower Secondary

SBB provides greater flexibility in subject
 offering at lower secondary levels, to better
 cater to the strengths of students in different
 subjects, and enhance their access to
 opportunities throughout their educational
 journey.

Subject-Based Banding (SBB) at Lower Secondary

- N(A) and N(T) students are eligible to take some subjects (English Language, Mathematics, Science and Mother Tongue Languages) at a higher academic level starting from Secondary 1 in 2018 if they have performed well in these subjects at PSLE:
 - N(A) and N(T) students who scored A* or A in a PSLE
 Standard subject can take the subject at the Express Level;
 and
 - N(T) students who scored at least C in a PSLE Standard subject or 1 in a PSLE Foundation subject can take it at N(A) Level.
- Cannot offer more than 3 higher level subjects

Subject-Based Banding (SBB) at Lower Secondary

2nd Intake (Mid-Year Inserts)

- If meets school-based criteria, option to offer subject from Semester 2

Course	School-based Results
N(A)	75% or higher in specific subject & 60% or higher in the overall average
N(T)	75% or higher in specific subject & 60% or higher in the overall average

3rd intake (End-Year Inserts)

 If meets school-based criteria, option to offer subject in Sec 2

Out-of-Stream Subjects at Upper Secondary

- School will offer out-of-stream subjects, i.e. subjects at a higher level to eligible Sec 3 N(A) students for EL, MT, Science and Mathematics
- However, each student could only offer up to a max of 3 out-of-stream subjects
