

CCA Policy

Participation

- CCA participation is compulsory for all pupils.
- All pupils are expected to take part in at least one CCA from the 4 groups, namely, Sports and Games, Uniformed Groups, Performing Arts, and Clubs & Societies.
- This CCA must be a school-based CCA
- At least 85% attendance rate

CCA Programme

- At the end of a student's secondary education, he/she will receive an attainment band for his/her CCA experience.
- The attainment will be converted to bonus points for gaining admission into junior colleges/centralized institutions or the polytechnics.


