CCA Policy

Participation

- CCA participation is **compulsory** for all pupils.
- All pupils are expected to take part in **one CCA** from Sports and Games, Uniformed Groups or Performing Arts.
- This CCA must be a **school-based CCA**
- At least **75%** attendance rate
- Poor CCA attendance **will** adversely affect your overall conduct grade.

CCA Programme

- At the end of a student's secondary education, he/she will receive an attainment band for his/her CCA experience.
- The attainment will be converted to bonus points for gaining admission into junior colleges/centralized institutions or the polytechnics.

CCA Awards

1) Active Participation Award (Sec 1- 3)

- For Sec 1, Sec 2 and Sec 3 students.
- At least 90% attendance.
- Has positive attitude and has made significant contributions in the year.
- One awardee per CCA (*per level*).

2) CCA Excellence Award (for Sec 4/5)

- One awardee per CCA.

- Notification letter will be issued


CCA induction *(handout pg 4-5)*


Layout @ MPH (level 4)
