Poly EAE is an **aptitude-based admissions** exercise that allows you to apply and receive a conditional offer for admission to polytechnic based on your **aptitudes and interests** before taking your O-Level exams.

If you choose not to apply to the polytechnics through Poly EAE, you may still do so through other admissions exercises like JAE.

Poly EAE is open to:

- Students who are Singapore Citizens/Permanent Residents and registered for O-Levels in year of Poly EAE
- International Students in Government, Government-aided or Independent Schools who are registered to sit for O-Levels in year of Poly EAE

To confirm a conditional offer, you will need to:

- Obtain net ELR2B2 of 26 points or better at the O-Level exams
- Meet Minimum Entry Requirements for the course

Confirmation of your conditional offer is automatic if you have met the criteria above. Thereafter, you will not be able to switch courses within or across polytechnics, or be eligible to participate in the 2018 Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE).
